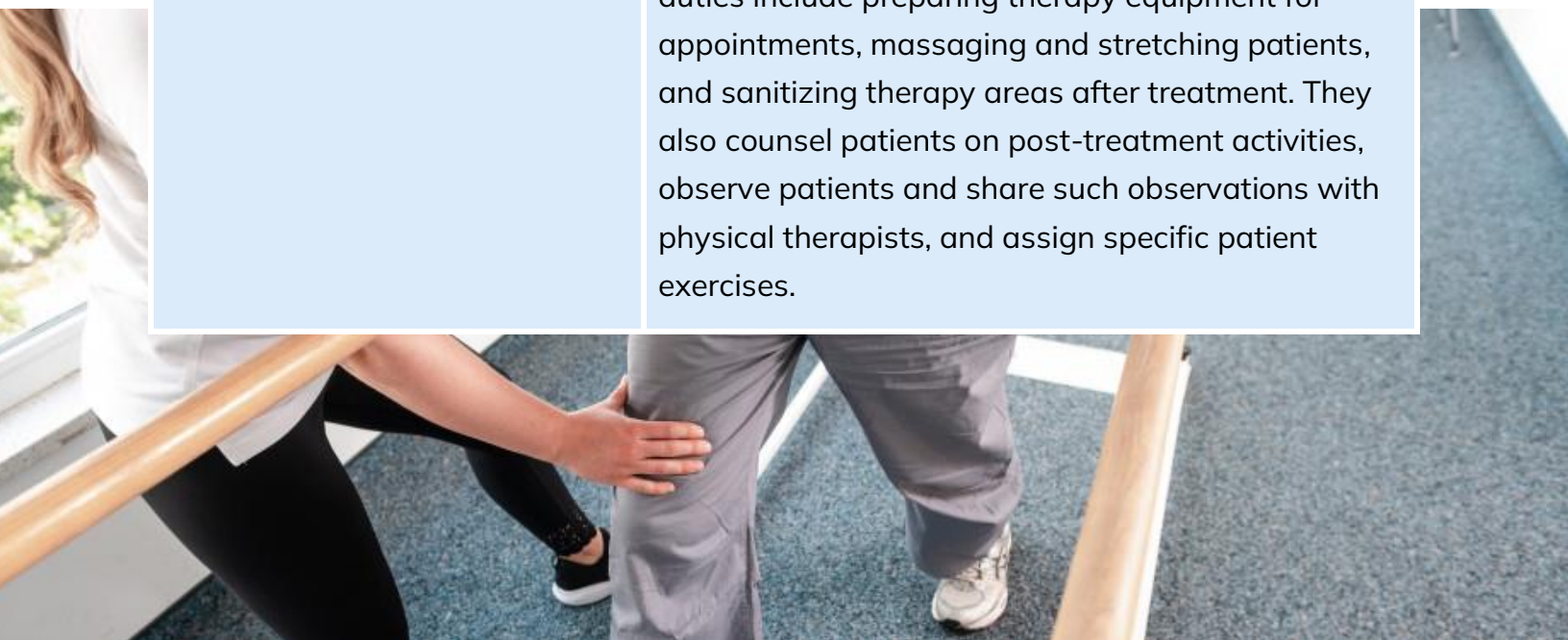
The Fastest Growing Jobs 2021-2029

Obtaining post-graduation employment can be exceptionally challenging. Defining the needed education level can help map out the career path for these clients. A study by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity projects that in the next eight years, the fastest growing jobs in Florida will be certification and associate education level careers. The following are some examples.

Career Paths for Associate Education

Physical Therapist Assistants

Projected Growth:	30.6%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$30.12
Description:	The Physical Therapist Assistants or PTAs work under the directives and supervision of the physical therapists. A PTA supports physical therapists in helping patients recovering from injuries to manage their pain and regain their mobility. The PTAs main duties include preparing therapy equipment for appointments, massaging and stretching patients, and sanitizing therapy areas after treatment. They also counsel patients on post-treatment activities, observe patients and share such observations with physical therapists, and assign specific patient exercises.



Audio and Video Equipment Technicians

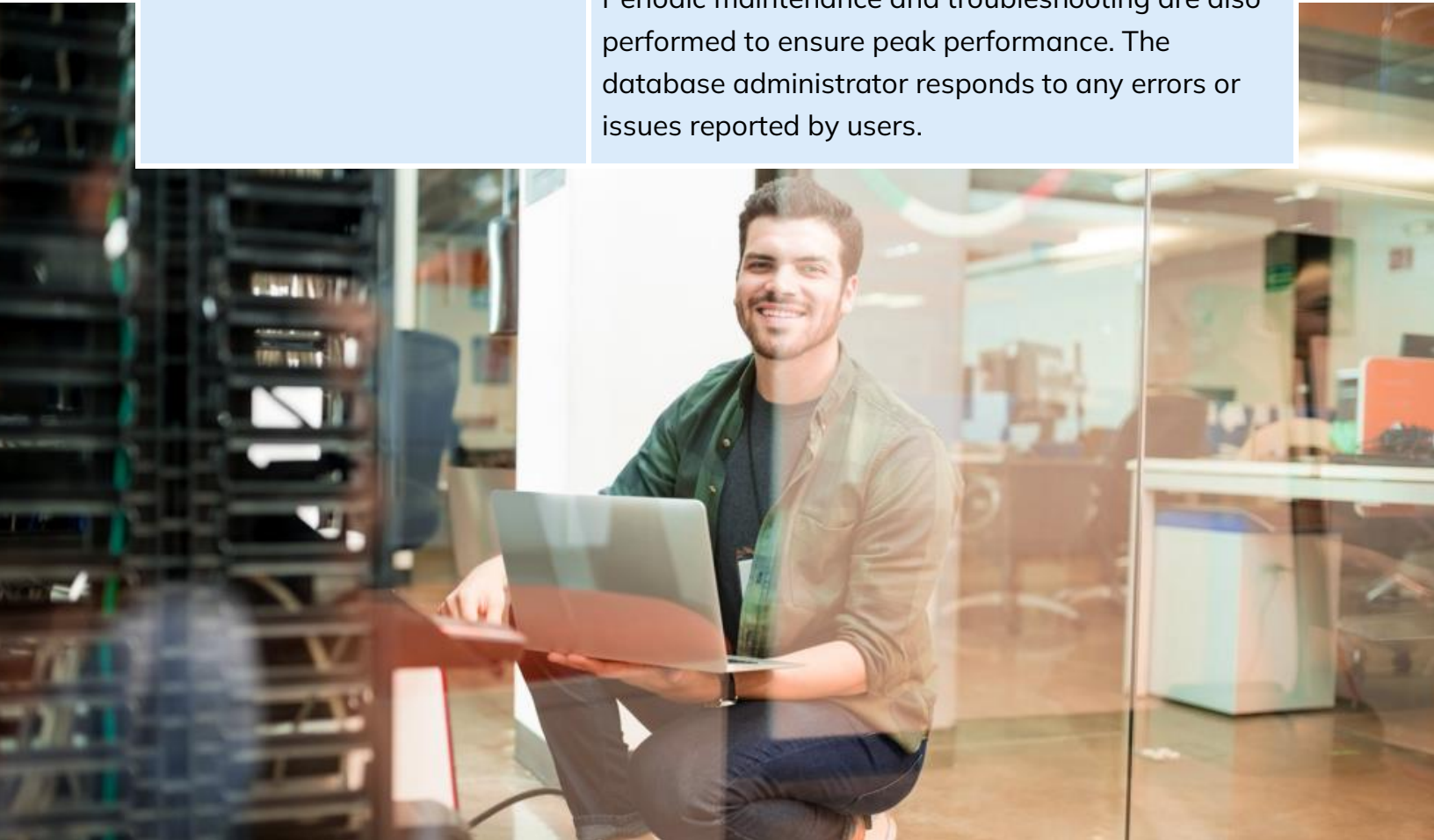
Projected Growth:	29.1%

Description:	Audio and Video Equipment Technicians are responsible for maintaining, setting up, operating and also dismantling audio, video, and lighting equipment for events. Equipment used includes sound speakers, microphones, cables, soundboards, graphics, mixing boards, video cameras, video monitors, and video servers. They ensure all equipment meets health and safety regulations. Such technicians also maintain strong customer relations and provide technical support during events to ensure an excellent live experience for the audience.

Computer System Analysts

Projected Growth:	17%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$39.07
Description:	Computer Systems Analysts study an organization's current computer systems, needs, and procedures and design system specifications to help the organization operate more efficiently and effectively and serve the needs of the organization. Analysts evaluate and configure hardware and software and determine strengths and weaknesses. They advise on IT infrastructure and provide cost analysis of future system initiatives. They also train users on system utilization, create user manuals, and regularly review and test systems to maintain function.

Database Administrators and Architects

Projected Growth:	19%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$39.07
Description:	Database Administrators and Architects are responsible for creating systems to store and secure data, including management and maintenance of company databases. They monitor performance, manage any issues that occur, and ensure security against unauthorized access. They also organize the system and its architecture and suggest changes and improvements. Database administrators ensure adherence to a data management policy and maintain functional company databases that are duplicated and stored in the event of memory loss. Periodic maintenance and troubleshooting are also performed to ensure peak performance. The database administrator responds to any errors or issues reported by users.



Respiratory Therapist

Projected Growth:	23.3%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$28.65
Description:	Respiratory therapists are trained to assess, diagnose, and treat patients with respiratory issues. Such therapists work with patients of all ages and wide-ranging pulmonary issues. They care for patients who have trouble with breathing or with other pulmonary distress like asthma, emphysema, bronchitis, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, chest trauma, lung cancer, and others. They work to restore natural breathing as possible. Respiratory therapists work in a variety of settings, including hospitals, clinics, intensive care units, and sometimes provide at-home patient care.

Event Planners

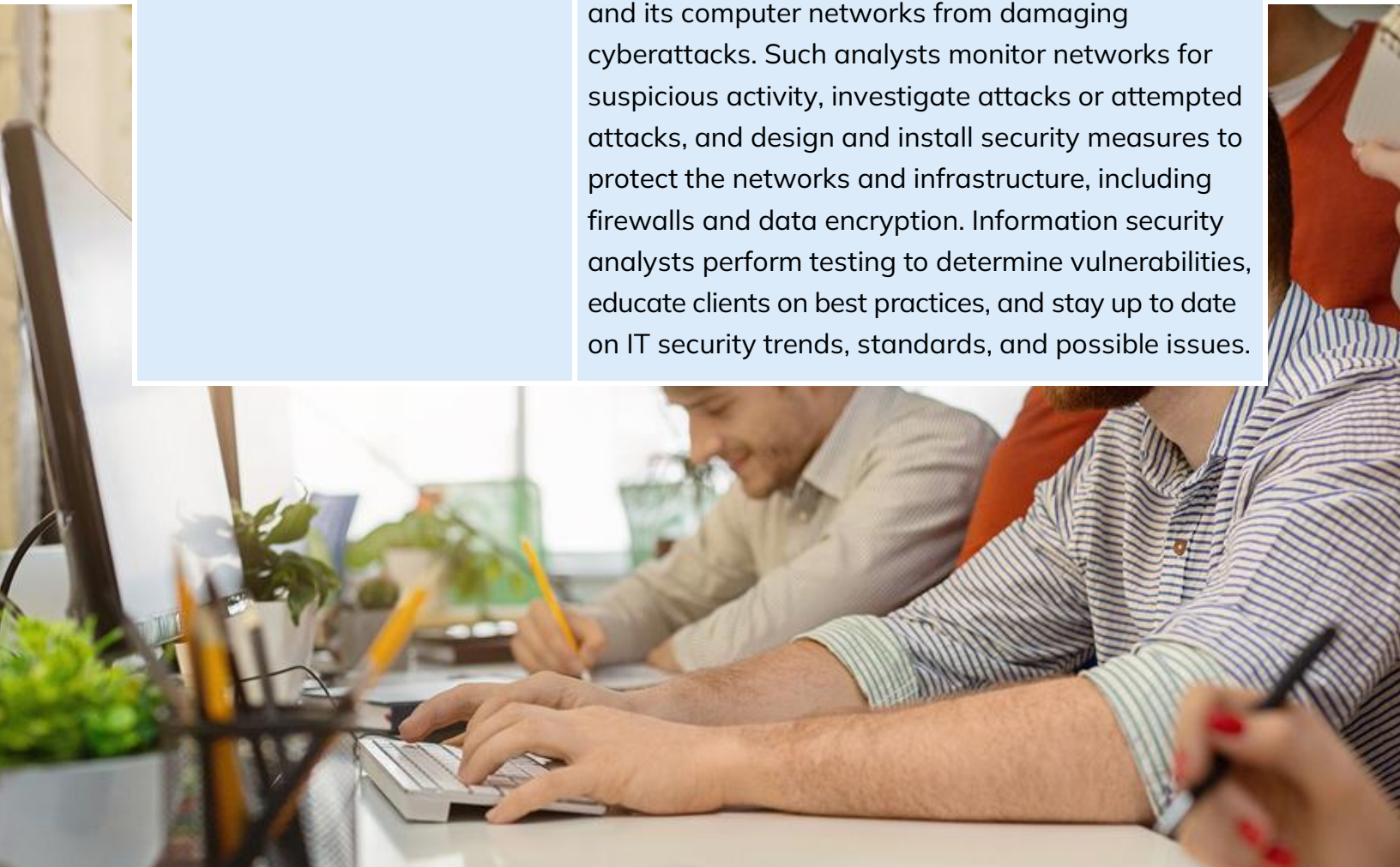
Projected Growth:	20.5%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$22.41
Description:	Event planning includes a wide variety of functions, from meetings and conventions to weddings and other celebrations. Event planners arrange all aspects of events, from the big picture to the tiny details. They meet with clients to discuss details and requirements, maintain a list of vendors to provide needed services, and oversee the event from set-up to execution and cleanup. Event planners must be detail oriented and organized, as they manage finances, procure appropriate venues, assist with

travel and lodging logistics to and from the event, organize needed technology, and monitor event activities to ensure client satisfaction.

Career Paths for Certification Education

Information Security Analysts

Projected Growth:	39.4%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$44.86
Description:	Information security analysts design, configure, and implement security systems to protect an organization and its computer networks from damaging cyberattacks. Such analysts monitor networks for suspicious activity, investigate attacks or attempted attacks, and design and install security measures to protect the networks and infrastructure, including firewalls and data encryption. Information security analysts perform testing to determine vulnerabilities, educate clients on best practices, and stay up to date on IT security trends, standards, and possible issues.



Medical assistants

Projected Growth:	25.1%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$16.39
Description:	Medical Assistants are health care professionals who assist physicians, nurses, and other medical staff in clinics and medical offices. Such employees escort patients throughout the office, conduct interviews to gather medical history, measure and document vitals (e.g., weight, height, blood pressure, temperature, etc.), and ensure all necessary information is completed and available prior to the patient's appointment. Medical assistants prepare the exam room and ensure supplies are stocked, instruments are maintained and sterilized, and waste is properly disposed. They maintain excellent communication with patients and doctors and ensure confidentiality on all appropriate items.

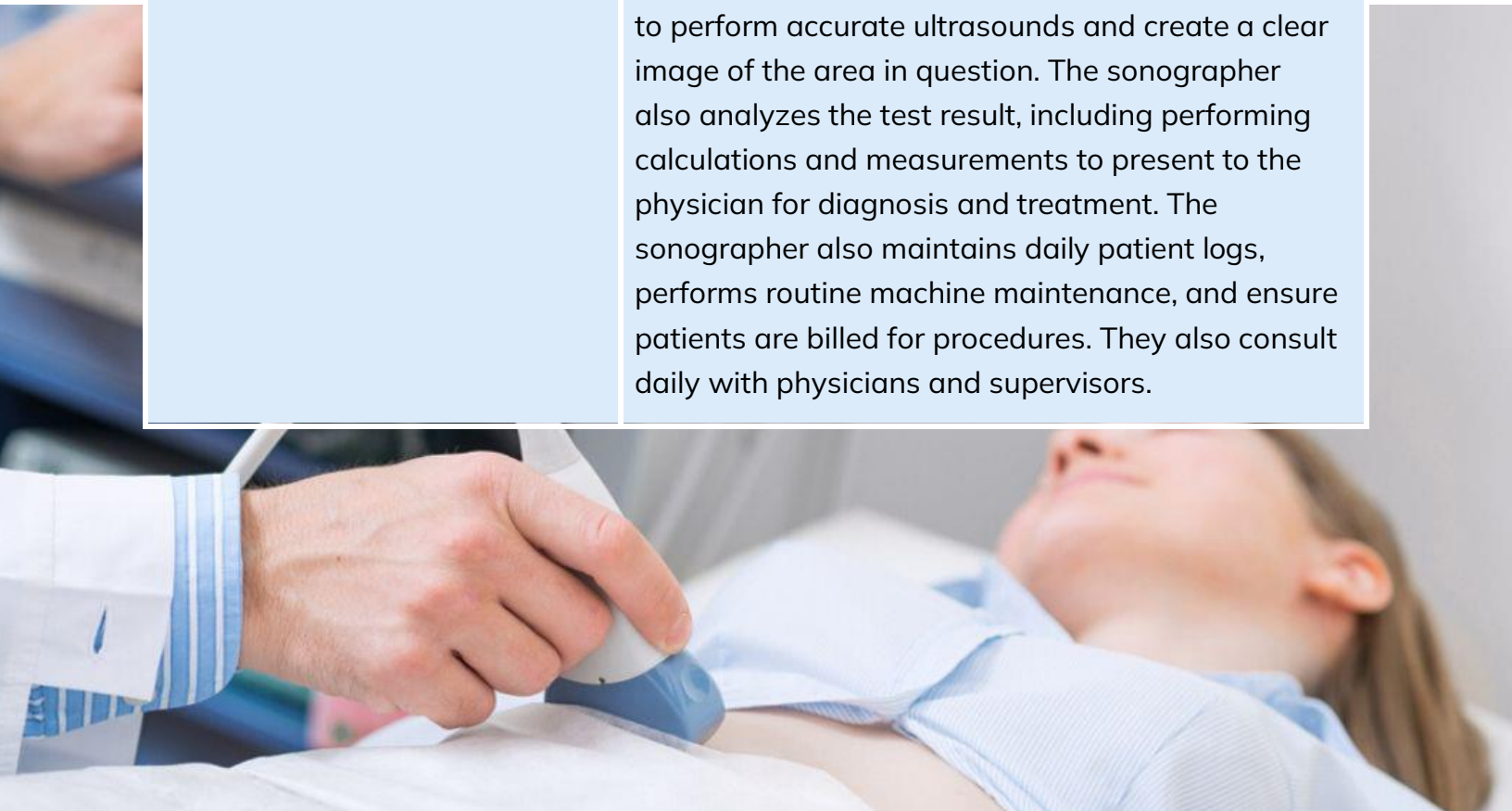
Aircraft Mechanics and Service Technicians

Projected Growth:	22.8%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$31.16
Description:	Aircraft Mechanics and service technicians maintain and repair aircraft systems and components, including airplanes, helicopters, and others. They are responsible for examining and inspecting aircraft components and equipment, including landing gear, hydraulic systems, breaks, and others. They diagnose malfunctions, fix them using power and hand tools, and ensure compliance with aviation safety rules

and regulations. Such mechanics must read and understand complex manuals and blueprints, maintain maintenance and repair logs, and run diagnostic tests. They also collaborate with other mechanics and electricians.

Diagnostic Medical Sonographers

Projected Growth:	22.2%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$33.02
Description:	A diagnostic medical sonographer, also known simply as a sonographer, uses equipment and soundwaves to form images of many parts of the body, known as ultrasounds; the images are then used to diagnose and treat a variety of medical conditions. Sonographers follow physicians' orders to perform accurate ultrasounds and create a clear image of the area in question. The sonographer also analyzes the test result, including performing calculations and measurements to present to the physician for diagnosis and treatment. The sonographer also maintains daily patient logs, performs routine machine maintenance, and ensure patients are billed for procedures. They also consult daily with physicians and supervisors.



Industrial Machinery Mechanics

Projected Growth:	18.9%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$23.84
Description:	Industrial machinery mechanics, also called maintenance machinists, ensure the operability of the machines used in assembly, packaging and manufacturing. These mechanics must understand how specific machines are assembled and operated. They examine the machines to detect and correct errors, they troubleshoot issues, and perform repairs on damaged or malfunctioning equipment. Machine mechanics also recommend equipment upgrades as necessary, and can project the life expectancy of the machines they oversee.

Paralegals and Legal Assistants

Projected Growth:	15.6%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$23.79
Description:	Paralegals and legal assistants perform a variety of tasks to support lawyers as they prepare legal documents for upcoming cases and trials. They maintain and organize documents for various legal proceedings and file them with the court as needed. Legal assistants and paralegals conduct legal research for attorneys, summarizing and reporting on relevant cases. They draft documents, including correspondence and affidavits, contracts, depositions, and pleadings. They also consult with attorneys, clients, and other legal professionals to gather details about their work.

Electricians

Projected Growth:	15.3%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$21.22
Description:	Electricians are responsible for the installation and maintenance of electrical wiring in buildings, transmission lines, machines, and other related equipment to house the wires and cables. Electricians connect systems to powerlines and test the systems to ensure proper installation and connectivity. They replace conduit, wiring, circuit breakers, and related items as needed. They must read blueprints, use hand and power tools, use diagnostic equipment, and display analytical and problem-solving skills.

Web Developers and Digital Interface Designers

Projected Growth:	18.8%
National Average Hourly Wage:	\$31.43
Description:	Web and digital interface designers are responsible for building, designing, and maintaining the look and feel of a website or interface using technical and creative skills. They consider photos, color, font type and size, graphics, and layout, among other variables that contribute websites and digital interfaces. They also consider the needs of the end user, including functionality, usability, and compatibility of the website or interface on a variety of devices. A web developer must have knowledge of computer software, HTML coding, and graphic design.
